

Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards (DoLS) for Managers



Target Audience

Managers across a range of Housing, Health and Social Care settings who have a responsibility for ensuring people receiving care and support are not unlawfully deprived of their liberty.

This course has been developed to ensure all learners have knowledge of how to support and implement the processes in place, within their services that they manage, so that people are not unlawfully deprived of their liberty.

This course will introduce Liberty Protection Safeguards (LPS) as the system which will be replacing DoLS in April 2022.
